Methods/Materials The materials we needed for this experiment is; paper, pencil and 60 students. Our procedure is as follows: 1.print 60 pages of our a and b questions. 2. bring students out one at a time and ask them "do you think you're a bully?" If the answer was no we direct them to pick up one of the pages labeled "a", if the answer was yes they should pick up a page labeled "b". 3. We leave them after assuring them that this questionnaire is completely anonymous to fill it out. 4. we tally up the results and make a graph. Results most students who took test A answered yes (I have) It teasing, calling mean names, yelling meanly, teasing about race/ethnicity, and punching/violence, very few sail yes to jealousy.

most students answering test B said yes to family issues/situation being a cause, thinking they are better than others, picking on others makes them feel/better about themselves, and being paid. The majority said no to being picked on by others, jealousy, and religious beliefs, this is not what we were expecting but it is also not far from our hypothesis. **Conclusions/Discussion** The top reasons our tests showed us they bullied was because they were "bored", because they wanted to fit in, and because they were paid.
